Chapter 44, Section 70B, or pursuant to any other enabling authority; that the City acknowledges that the MSBA's grant program is a non-entitlement, discretionary program based on need, as determined by the MSBA, and any project costs the City incurs in excess of any grant that may be received from the MSBA shall be the sole responsibility of the City; provided further that any grant that the City of New Bedford may receive from the MSBA for the eligible portion of the Project shall not exceed the lesser of (1) eighty percent (80%) of eligible, approved project costs, as determined by the MSBA, or (2) the total maximum grant amount determined by the MSBA; and provided that the amount of borrowing authorized pursuant to this Order shall be reduced by any grant amount set forth in the Project Funding Agreement that may be executed between the City and MSBA

FURTHER, That the Treasurer is authorized to file an application with the Municipal Finance Oversight Board to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds and to provide such information and execute such documents as the Municipal Finance Oversight Board may require for these purposes.

FURTHER, That any premium received by the City upon the sale or any bonds or notes hereunder, less any such applied to the payment of the costs of issuance of such bonds or notes, may be applied to pay project costs and the amount authorized to be borrowed hereunder shall be reduced by the amount of any such premium so applied; and that the Mayor is authorized to take any other action necessary to carry out this Project.

That \$71,800,000.00 is appropriated for the purpose of financing the capital planning, construction and all associated costs for implementation of water distribution and treatment systems improvements including but not limited to Quittacas Water Treatment Plant Upgrades consisting of repairs and replacement of the HVAC system, an assessment of process modifications to use caustic, sedimentation basin improvements and other equipment upgrades, a Lead Service Line Abatement program to replace lead services and water mains in the City for public health purposes, developing a uni-directional flushing program, and Distribution System Improvement consisting of reinforcement of two 48-in transmission mains at Braley Road and a 16-in transmission main in Industrial Park, and general system improvements, including all costs thereof as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C of the General Laws; that to meet this appropriation the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor and the Committee on Finance is authorized to borrow \$71,800,000.00 and issue bonds or notes therefore under Chapter 44 of the General Laws and/or Chapter 29C of the General Laws; that such bonds or notes shall be general obligations of the City unless the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor and the Committee on Finance determines that they should be issued as limited obligations and may be secured by local system revenues as defined in Section 1 of Chapter 29C; that the Treasurer with the approval of the Mayor and the Committee on Finance is authorized to borrow all or a portion of such amount from the Massachusetts Clean Water Trust established pursuant to Chapter 29C of the General Laws; and in connection therewith to enter into a loan agreement and/or a security agreement with the Trust and otherwise to contract with the Trust and the Department of Environmental Protection with respect to such loan and for any federal or state aid available for the project or for the financing thereof; that the Mayor is authorized to enter into a project regulatory agreement with the Department of Environmental Protection, to expend all funds available for the project and to take any other action necessary to carry out the project.

FURTHER ORDERED: That any premium received by the City upon the sale of any bonds or notes approved by the order, less the costs of preparing issuing and marketing them, and any accrued interest received upon the delivered of such bonds or notes, shall be applied to the payment of project costs approved by this order, thereby reducing the amount authorized to be borrowed to pay costs by a like amount.

RESOLUTION HONORING ST. LAWRENCE MARTYR CHURCH ON ITS 200^{TH} ANNIVERSARY

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence Martyr Church was originally established as St. Mary's Church on the Feast of St. Joseph, March 19, 1821, and is the 4th oldest Catholic Church in Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence Martyr is the mother Church of the Diocese of Fall River; and

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence Martyr Parish is an inner-city parish, with a 200-year-old history and a parish school; the mission of St. Lawrence Martyr Parish continues after two centuries when they were blessed with their patron St. Lawrence's great example of serving those in need, believing that they were the true treasures of the church; and

WHEREAS, The parish established a Catholic Cemetery, three parochial schools, the first Catholic High School, and a Catholic hospital, all of which had been staffed by Sisters of Mercy; and

WHEREAS, The land where St. Lawrence Martyr Church stands to this day at County and Hillman Streets was purchased from Dr. Lyman Bartlett by Father Henniss, who was appointed to St. Mary's Parish and was New Bedford's first American-born Priest and was Pastor of the church for 5-6 years and for 3 of those years laid the foundation for the present prosperity of the parish; and

WHEREAS, Measures were taken for the building of the church, but the Civil War broke out and construction had to be postponed, with ground eventually being broken for the church in May of 1866, and the corner stone laid November 1st of that year; and

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence Martyr Church was first opened to the public on Christmas morning 1870, with over 600 people attending the 5:00 a.m. Sunday Mass; and

WHEREAS, The membership of St. Lawrence Martyr Church constantly increased, and the parish continued to prosper; and

WHEREAS, The St. Lawrence Martyr Church is known for its magnificent bell and clock tower; and

WHEREAS, In 1995, when Blessed Mother Teresa of Calcutta visited New Bedford, she chose to worship at St. Lawrence Martyr Church:
