

What is Shining Lights?

Shining Lights is a free ESOL (English for speakers of another language) program offered by The City of New Bedford, offering Adult Basic English classes for Beginning-level adult students. Shining Lights Program is a 34-Weeks program from September through June at four locations through the city; Bay Village NBHA Office, Global Learning Charter Public School, Grace Episcopal Church, and Presidential Height NBHA Office. Classes are offered in the morning or evening.

In addition to English lessons, Shining Lights also offers life- skills seminars (e.g. Tenant & Consumer Rights), as well as History & Civics workshops and Citizenship preparation.

The Office of Human Services began its "Shining Lights" ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) Program in 2006 to meet the need for newly arrived immigrants who were not ready for traditional ESOL classes.

Shining Lights focuses on basic literacy and conversational English skills, and is staffed by volunteer teachers.

Since its inception, Shining Lights has served over 400 adult learners to date and provided structured out-of-school programs for over 100 infants and school-aged children while their parents are in class.
