October 3-4 Rosh Hashanah- Beginning of the Jewish New Year and first of the High Holy Days which marks the beginning of 10 day period of pentinence.

October 11 Columbus Day- U.S. Holiday

October 11 Indigenous People's Day- Celebrates and honors Native American history and culture.

November 12 Diwali- The Hindu, Jai and Sikh five day festival of lights celebrates new beginnings and the triumph of good over evil and lightness over darkness.

November 28 Thanksgiving – U.S. Holiday- For some a day of mourning.

December 7-15 Hanukkah- 8 day festival of lights. Hanukkah celebrates the victory of the Maccabees of Israelites over the Greek Syrian ruler, Antiochus.
