- ✓ ICS command center will be manned by NBPD, NBFD, Feast committee, EMS (located in main hall). ICS contingency plans have been followed including preliminary security meetings with all department heads, and table top exercise with St. Luke's Hospital group.
- ✓ Current security system upgraded with all new cameras, (2) 65” monitors, laptops and operating system to include

10 wireless cameras, wireless cameras from Almar de Mar school, and NBPD cameras. Total cameras in use will be approximately 32-36 cameras. Cameras have been added in all locations that were deemed to be “not covered” by the current system. Presumably the entire grounds including the perimeter should be covered by all cameras when operational.

- ✓ Jersey barriers are being replaced with sanding trucks from DPI and or Fire trucks at all “entrance” points affording greater protection and ease of movement in case of emergency, bollards will be placed in sidewalks to stop possibility of cars driving on them and injuring patrons. In addition there will be 12 light towers in use this year over 3 last year to ensure that the perimeter is well lit for patrons and emergency personnel for everyone’s safety. EXIT signs will be painted on the ground directly in front of all exits and will include arrows properly placed to designate the correct direction of travel to exit. In addition photo luminiscent exit signs will be attached to all gates that abut these exit areas.
- ✓ An additional gate has been added in the middle of the Feast grounds on the Hathaway street side affording another form of egress and regress. This gate will be approx.. 24-28’ in length while open and will allow for better flow of patrons during normal hours of operation as well as in the case of an emergency situation.
- ✓ System upgraded has been completed for communications to designate all emergency personnel to one primary channel for entirety of the Feast. This allows emergency personnel direct use of a designated channel (5) so as not to interfere with normal operations of police and fire channels. A separate dispatcher will also be designated solely for the Feast on this channel.
- ✓ Gillette stadium protocol as it pertains to bags has been adopted and will be enforced and posted on the Feast website. Again there will be no backpacks, clear bags only, and all bags are subject to search.
