MOTION TO ACCEPT THE MEETING MINUTES OF January 25, 2016 - Unanimous

APPROVALS RECEIVED FROM THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES CONTROL COMMISSION

Change of Manager - Trans. # 174 – Plot # 18--107

People’s Liquor Store, Inc. d/b/a Douglas Wine & Spirits, Inc., 446 Dartmouth Street, is requesting the approval of Thorpe J. Doran, who resides at 942 Howland Street, South Dartmouth, MA. as their new manager.

Change of Officers & Directors - Trans. # 073 – Plot # 25--88

Portuguese Sports Club, Inc., Francisco Tavares, (new) President, who is petitioning for a **Change of Officers and Directors of the Club All Alcoholic Beverages license**. The petitioner is requesting that the resignations of the current slate of Officers and Directors currently on file with the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission be accepted, and be updated as follows, per the Commission’s directive of 09/30/14 regarding “Club” licenses. Upon approval, Francisco Tavares will be the President, Joao Vasslo will be the Vice-President, Paul Santos will be the Treasurer, and Mario Tavares will be the Secretary. All are Directors. Premises will remain the same at **56 Delano Street**.

VOTED: To accept all the approvals from the ABCC and place them on file. – **Unanimous**

1. Request To Be Heard

A written request from Kevin Santos regarding a planned expansion of the Waterfront Grille’s outside patio area from 806 sq. ft. to 2,000 sq. ft.; as well as a request for expanded hours for outside entertainment.

Present: Kevin Santos, Owner

Responding to questions from Chairman Beaugard, Mr. Santos stated that he was asking for preliminary approval to extend his existing patio out, as well as requesting approval to extend the hours for which entertainment could be offered within the patio area.

Mr. Santos stated that he was looking to extend the existing patio on the south side of the building from roughly 806 sq. ft. to roughly 2,000 sq. ft.; and that he currently has fourteen (14) seats at the bar as well as nine (9) tables with four (4) seats at each.

Mr. Santos stated that although they’re expanding the area, the amount of seats probably would not increase and that more than likely, it would probably decrease by three tables, and that the area would be enclosed by jersey barriers.

With regard to the entertainment, Mr. Santos stated the entertainment would be offered on Friday, Saturday, and

Sunday nights, from June to Labor Day, and it would not go any later than 12:00 a.m. Mr. Santos presented pictures to the Board showing that there were no residential areas in close proximity to his restaurant, and that he would face the speakers out towards the water.

When asked by Chairman Beauregard as to what type of entertainment he would be offering, Mr. Santos responded, last week we had the Southcoast Symphony ... some jazz ... so that type of music ... it's not going to be anything out of control ... in eight years ... I've never had a violation there ... we never had any issues ... we hear it all the time ... why don't you have something outside? Mr. Santos concluded his remarks by stating that if the Board so wished, he would get a noise expert to do a noise study.

Commissioner Craig stated, if the request is approved, I would like it stipulated that the area be enclosed with jersey barriers to ensure the safety of the patrons; to which Mr. Santos stated, that is my intention, I don't want any issues.

ACTION TAKEN: Based on the information provided by Mr. Santos, the Board gave initial approval to extend the current outdoor patio to the front of the building (approx. 2,000 sq. ft.) and to allow entertainment to continue to be offered in that area, as previously approved.

NOTE: Mr. Nanopoulos informed Mr. Santos that he would check with the ABCC to determine what paperwork, if any, would have to be submitted to initiate the change or if it could be done as an administrative change on a Board vote.

2. PETITION - Trans. # 110 – Plot # 19--48

The Sky Room, Inc. d/b/a The Sky Room, John E. Williams, Pledge Holder, who is petitioning to **transfer a Common Victualler (Restaurant) All Alcoholic Beverages License to Howland Mills Restaurant, Inc. d/b/a The Sky Room**. Upon approval, John E. Williams will be the President, Co-Director, and Co-Shareholder (50%); and **Curtis J. Mello** will be the Treasurer, Secretary, Co-Director, Co-Shareholder (50%), and **Proposed Manager**. The description of the premises will remain the same as follows: The license premises consists of five (5) rooms to include one (1) VIP Room w/bar, two (2) Function Rooms w/bars, one (1) Game Room, and one (1) Main Entertainment Room with a bar, DJ Booth, and Stage Area with a Dance Floor; along with a Kitchen and Storage Area on the fourth floor of a commercial building within an area approx. 17,000 Sq. Ft.

There are three (3) entrances/exits in the front of the building and an emergency exit in the back of the building; the area is also accessible by an elevator and an escalator. Premise is situated on the west side of Orchard Street and is numbered **651 Orchard Street**.

Final approval will require a **'Change of Tenant'** from the Building Department, a new **'Food Permit'** from the Health Department, and a copy of **'Proof of Liquor Liability'**.

Application has been advertised.

Present: Atty. John E. Williams, President/Co-Owner

Responding to Questions from Chairman Beauregard, Atty. Williams stated that Howland Mills Restaurant, Inc. foreclosed on the security interests in order to get the license back into our name, and this application is required to do that.

Atty. Williams informed the Board that they have a couple of people interested in doing a function room up there but we first need to get the license back into our name in order for us to transfer the license.

Voted: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to approve the petition as presented and to forward the application to the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission for their approval. – **Unanimous**

3. PETITION - Trans. # 231 – Plot # 28--287

Expedito Duarte d/b/a Expo's II, who is petitioning as an individual for a **New Retail Package Store Wine and Malt Only Beverages License**. The proposed licensed premises is a convenience store located on the first floor of a two-story building in an area approximately 1,930 sq. ft., which will include a walk-in cooler for the storage of alcohol, as well as three (3) coolers and shelving for the sale and display of alcohol; the area also includes an office and a room for storage. Alcohol will also be stored in the basement. There are two (2) entrances/exits in the front of the building, as well as one exit located at the rear of the building. The premise is situated on the west side of Dartmouth Street between Edward and Stowell Street, and will be numbered **309**

Dartmouth Street.

Final approval will require a **‘Certificate of Inspection** from the Building Department.

Application has been advertised; Abutters have been notified.

Present: Expedito Duarte, Applicant

Mr. Nanopoulos opened the hearing by reading into the record a letter submitted by Kerry Winterson, Ward Five City Councilor, which the Board voted unanimously to receive and place on file that stated the following:

I am writing to inform you that I will be unable to attend the meeting of the Licensing Board, on Monday, February 29, 2016, due to a previously scheduled commitment. I would however, like to stake my support for Petition # 3, the request by Expedito Duarte d/b/a Expo's II, for a New Retail Package Store Wine and malt Only beverages License at 309 Dartmouth Street.

Please read this letter into the record to make my colleagues, those in attendance, and the public aware of the reason for my absence and of my support of Petition #3.

Chairman Beaugard stated the following to Mr. Nanopoulos and his fellow Board members:

Just to be open and in fairness, I just want to announce that Mr. Duarte has interest in a property that is next door to me, to my home, so I'm going to recuse myself from voting or any activity in any activity in this hearing.

Chairman Beaugard opened the hearing by stating to Mr. Duarte, with that being said, would you please state to the Board what your intentions are for the license that you're asking for.

Mr. Duarte responded, my intentions are to open up a beer and wine liquor at existing store at 309 Dartmouth Street, which has been there for sixteen years.

Mr. Duarte then read from a prepared statement that stated the following:

My goal in this model is to treat customers as I would like to be treated in a friendly environment that is clean and neat with customer service at its best ... I've done that for years with great appreciation for my customers ... I've been in business for over twenty years ... self employed ... as we all know ... times have changed for business owners and for property owners as well ... as we are all aware ... with taxes increasing along with minimum wage increasing by the state at an alarming 10 % increase on the minimum wage from \$10.00 an hour to \$11.00 an hour next year ... that becomes a burden and a risk for many business owners to profit ... if business owners do not change ... or re-invent new ideas ... many will shut down or go out of business ... while talking to a friend of mine ... a business owner ... Joe Saraiva who is the President and Owner of Saraiva Enterprises, Inc. ... who is a world importer of fine wines and beers ... we discussed doing something on the other side of the store on Dartmouth Street ... which has been vacant and used just as a storage room for sixteen years ... and this is why I'm here tonight asking the Board to help approve my request for a new beer and wine license ... to allow me to sell merchandise to satisfy the people of New Bedford to a new fresh variety and to a special quality of wines to our wide range of ethnicity and culture of our City of New Bedford at a great value price.

Upon being recognized by Chairman Beaugard, Commissioner Craig was the first to respond to Mr. Duarte's request by stating, I've known Expo (Mr. Duarte) for a number of years ... I certainly can't say anything bad about his character ... my biggest concern with this is something that the Licensing Board has to take into consideration ... and that's the issue of 'public need' ... and is this case here ... in less than a half of a mile area ... we have 6 places (existing package stores) already ... of which ... 3 serve all alcohol ... and 3 of which ... serve wine and malt ... which is what he's requesting ... and you also have another package store that is less than a mile (7/10ths) away ... County Street Liquors (~~Re Art's~~ Commissioner Craig misspoke) ... so this is a concern.

Commissioner Craig then addressed Mr. Duarte by asking, maybe you can answer this question ... there's a 'Little People's College' ... but I'm not certain ... Is that still in existence? ... Is that still in operation?

Mr. Duarte responded, yes it is.

Commissioner Craig responded, that's something else we'll have to consider.

Commissioner Almeida responded, that's right next to you, isn't it?

Mr. Duarte responded, no, actually it's about three blocks over (actually - 1 ½ blocks).

Commissioner Craig responded, there are 6 or 7 things we look at ... and one, the most important one is the 'public need' ... so where would the need be when there are 7 others ... with 6 within a half mile ... and one within a ¼ of a mile ... that serve what you are looking to serve.

Mr. Duarte responded, the need is always there ... specializing in specific brands and products ... that are not out

there ... demanding by the public ... they've been asking me for years ... I just chose not to do it ... the building is also mine ... and the commercial rate is 33% in the City of New Bedford ... it's gone through the roof ... so it will help revive the business of the store... cigarette business has been down greatly ... that's 90% of my business.

Commissioner Almeida then stated that he also shared Commissioner Craig's concern about the lack of 'public need' in the area based on the number of package store licenses already issued in that area already, as well as the additional concern of the close proximity of a day care center ("Little People's College") to the requested location; and after considering the Ballarin Factors, he was inclined to deny the application at this time.

Voted: Commissioner Almeida made a motion not to approve the application based on the lack of public need of a new package store license in that area; it was based on the opinion of the majority that a number of off premise liquor licenses (6) already exist within close proximity of your premises and therefore satisfies the public need for that area. The Board also considered that there was a daycare center in close proximity of the proposed new location; the motion passed on a 2-0 vote on a second by Commissioner Craig (Chairman Beauregard abstained from the vote as a result of his recusal. – **Unanimous**

**The licensee has the right to appeal this decision to the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission under the provisions of Ch. 138 of M.G. L. within five (5) days of receipt of the decision notice with a copy submitted to this office.

VOTED: Commissioner Almeida made a motion to take up **Item #'s 4 – 17** at one time; waive reading; and approve the applications as presented – **Unanimous**

18. Hearing: Young Cape Verdean Athletic Association, Inc.

Your presence is requested at a hearing to determine whether you have violated certain provisions of Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (ABCC) Regulations and Licensing Board Rules and Regulations. Based on their findings, the Licensing Board may take action to suspend your license until this matter is resolved.

ABCC Regulation 204 CMR 2.05: (2)-

States no licensee shall permit any illegality to occur on the licensed premises. The licensee is responsible, whether present or not, for ensuring that no disorder, disturbance, or illegality takes place in or on a licensed premises.

Licensing Board Regulation No. 6,

Each Corporate Licensee shall appoint a Manager who shall have full authority and control of the premises and who shall be satisfactory to the Board; immediate notice of the appointment must be made to the Board in writing.

This hearing will focus on the control and operations of the licensed premises, as well as your failure to secure a Certificate of Good Standing from the Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA) in a timely manner, which is required to complete your application for a Change of Officers, Directors, and Manager, which was returned once again by the ABCC on 10/08/15. The Board is deeply concerned that you have been operating without an approved manager since December of 2014, as well as your failure to resolve your outstanding issues with the DUA in a timely manner.

You have until November 12, 2015 to submit the requested documents.

As a result of your failure to comply in a timely manner, the Board will entertain testimony as to the actions of the Young Cape Verdean Athletic Association. Short of full compliance, the Board must take action and **as such, you are hereby ordered to bring with you your 2015 Liquor License**. Depending on the Board's findings, you may be required to surrender your license until this matter is resolved.

Decision of Board of 11/16/15 Meeting

Based on the club's failure to secure a Certificate of Good Standing from the Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA) and the Department of Revenue (DOR), as well as the recent resignations of the proposed treasurer and manager; the Board voted unanimously to suspend your license effective immediately until such time as we are provided with a certificate of good standing from the DUA and DOR and that a revised application is submitted and approved by this Board and the ABCC.

You will have until December 14, 2015 to submit the required documents; short of full compliance, the Board may take action to revoke your license.

The Board is deeply concerned that you have been operating without an approved manager since December of 2014, as well as your inability to resolve your outstanding issues with the DUA and DOR in a timely manner. You have the right to appeal this decision to the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission under the provisions

of Ch. 138 of M.G. L. within five (5) days of receipt of this notice with a copy submitted to this office.

Minutes of 12/21/15 Meeting

Present: Donald Soares, President along with Dulceiann Mello, 'current' Manager of Record, John L. Maciel, Proposed New Manager, and Mary Barrett-Maciel, Treasurer

Mr. Nanopoulos informed the Board that he did receive an application from Atty. Medeiros' office on behalf of the YA Club, but there were documents missing and there was no DOR Certificate included in the packet; therefore, it's not on the agenda as requested by the Board at its last meeting.

Mr. Nanopoulos reminded the Board of the current status of the license by stating that the club signed the license renewal but that it was suspended by the Board at its last meeting based on the club's failure to secure a Certificate of Good Standing from the Department of Unemployment Assistance (DUA) and the Department of Revenue (DOR), as well as the recent resignations of the proposed treasurer and manager; until such time as the Board is provided with a certificate of good standing from the DUA and DOR and a revised application is submitted and approved by this Board and the ABCC; and that the club was given until December 14th to submit the required documents; with notice, that short of full compliance, the Board may take action to revoke their license.

Mr. Nanopoulos completed his remarks by stating, based on what was submitted, the club is not in compliance with the Board's November 16th decision.

Chairman Beauregard then recognized Ms. Barrett to address the Board as to where they were at the moment with regard to resolving their outstanding issues, in order to get an approved and proper manager in place, which has been lacking for the past year.

Ms. Barrett stated, we've been in contact with Dan at the DUA and Richard Senecal with the DOR ... when we spoke with Mr. Senecal today ... he stated he was going to give us a new payment plan ... from \$2,100 a month ... he was going to drop it to \$1,000.00 a month ... but he said he wouldn't send it to us ... unless we got the license back ... and with the DUA ... they've adjusted the payments to \$195.86 ... it was \$288.00 before.

Chairman Beauregard responded to Ms. Barrett's comments by asking, so with just those two expenses ... which would be \$1,200.00 a month roughly ... which based on what you stated to the Board at the last meeting ... you have 18 members ... so before you even open the doors ... you have a monthly expense of \$1,200.00 ... so I'm asking you based on what you stated to this Board ... with 18 members ... before you pay any rent to Mr. DeMello ... before you purchase any alcohol ... before you do anything ... you have a \$1,200.00 expense ... you still need to heat the building ... you need electricity ... you have to pay your help ... how do you do that with 18 members?

Ms. Barrett responded, I figured ... once we opened ... we could start making the money back ... but like I said before ... me and my husband have already been donating ... so the thing is ... so once we get back into the club ... we plan on doing different functions ... and keeping things moving.

Ms. Barrett then stated ... hopefully ... between my husband, who is the proposed new manager ... and myself, as the incoming treasurer, we can keep things moving in a positive manner ... we're doing an audit to try to figure things out ... it's a little difficult ... I'll admit that ... but the club does make money ... it's not like it's not making money ... we've had people that weren't doing what they were supposed to be doing.

Chairman Beauregard responded by asking ... again ... how do you make money with 18 members? ... that's not my number ... that's the number you gave to the Board.

Ms. Barrett responded, we do functions ... we do rentals and stuff like that ... so we gain extra money here and there.

Chairman Beauregard responded, so, part of the deal with us is that all of this had to be resolved by December 14th ... we've been dealing with this for a year now ... and the deal was at the last meeting ... that if the application wasn't submitted and the taxes weren't under agreement ... that we were not going to renew (revoke) the license ... and sitting here now ... neither has been completed ... we haven't had a manager in place for well over a year.

In response to Ms. Barrett's insistence that they have agreements in place with the DOR and the DUA, Chairman

Beauregard responded, in the past we've been told the same thing ... if we do this ... this happens ... then we step up to the plate and we do our end of the deal ... and whoever ... and I'm not saying you ... or the previous regime ... but we've had multiple previous administrations that have come and sat in front of us ... and nobody has kept their end of the bargain ... except us.

When asked by Commissioner Almeida as to how much more time they would need, Ms. Barrett responded, I don't think it would be that much longer.

When asked by Commissioner Almeida if the club had any money in their kitty now, Ms. Barrett stated that they did not but they still have liquor, that's still there.

When asked by Commissioner Almeida if they had the \$2,300.00 to pay the 2016 liquor license fee, Ms. Barrett stated that her and her husband would pay the fee on Wednesday.

When asked by Commissioner Craig as to where the money would come from, since the club had no funds, Ms. Barrett stated, it would come from my personal funds.

Commissioner Craig responded, are you sure you want to put yourself in this deep ... it looks to me that you're fighting a never ending battle ... it seems to me that this situation just seems to keep going on and on and on ... it's obvious to us that your intentions are good ... I think you should really think twice about this ... I think you're digging yourself a hole for which you'll be sorry ... whatever you put into it ... what you're willing to put up now ... how are you going to get that back ... honestly?

Commissioner Almeida added that's \$4,500.00 ... and that's with nothing else ... that's just the first tax payments and the liquor license fee.

Ms. Barrett responded, I guess we would have to take a loss!

Commissioner Craig responded, I think we would be doing you a favor to deny this myself.

Chairman Beauregard then called for a motion.

Commissioner Almeida stated that it was his feeling that because the club failed to meet the deadline, that the license should remain suspended.

Ms. Barrett responded, the thing is ... I know they ran it like it was a bar but it's not a bar ... not to me ... to me ... it means much more than that ... I would really like to get the club back to its roots ... to what it was supposed to be ... an athletic club ... helping out the community ... these are things that I want to do ... that's why I'm back into it ... and trying to fight for it.

Chairman Beauregard responded, quite frankly Ms. Barrett ... a lot of these ... and I understand where it came from ... like the Panther's Club ... but a lot of them have just run their course ... the younger generation isn't as into it as the older generation ... you don't have them hanging around ... wives aren't as tolerant as they were years ago ... there's a big difference between my mother and my wife ... sometimes you just have to say that the era is over ... you put up a good fight ... and I think this might be it ... let's say you have 30 members ... I don't know how many you have ... let's say you have 60 ... you still don't have enough to sustain the organization ... you're going to say ... let's put on a drive ... the Vets is struggling ... the Band Club is struggling ... everybody is going after the same people to keep their places alive ... to re-iterate Commissioner Craig's comments ... we may be doing you a favor ... I think he worded it very well ... you'd be spending good money after bad for a building you don't own ... obviously there's some hard feelings between the landlord and the organization ... otherwise he would not have bailed out after the last meeting ... the more we go ... we had the accountant sitting here at one meeting ... and he was working with him and he was going to turn it around ... he gave us the same rah ... rah speech ... and we're still back here again saying ... give us the license.

Chairman Beauregard then asked Commissioner Almeida if his motion was to revoke (not renew) or to continue the suspension of the license, to which Commissioner Almeida responded, it's to continue the suspension depending on how much time they would need.

Commissioner Almeida once again noted that the club would have to come up with the \$2,300.00 for the renewal fee, as well as another \$1200.00 for the first two tax payments in order to get their license back.

Mr. Nanopoulos made it clear to Ms. Barrett, that if the Board did approve the renewal and voted to keep the suspension in place until January to give the club additional time to complete their application and resolve their issues with the DUA and DOR; and if for some reason that doesn't get done, the Board could take action at that time to revoke the license, and she would be out of the \$2,300.00. Mr. Nanopoulos made it clear that the only thing the ABCC would accept is the actual Certificate of Good Standing from the DOR.

Ms. Barrett stated she understood and that she would take that chance.

Commissioner Craig reaffirmed with Ms. Barrett that she understood what was explained to her, to which Ms. Barrett responded, I do ... I do ... I'll take that chance.

With that, Commissioner Craig seconded the motion which was put to a vote by Chairman Beauregard.

The club has entered into a payment plan with the DUA and they will sign off on the application when it's sent up, but we are still working with the DOR to reach an agreement on a payment plan. As you know, there was an application filed with other parties involved on behalf of the YA Club, and that application was not approved by the ABCC, and was therefore rescinded by the Board tonight, as a result of two of the parties involved resigning their positions.
