Dear Secretary Theoharides,

The Natural Heritage & Endangered Species Program of the Massachusetts Division of Fisheries & Wildlife (the Division) has reviewed the *Environmental Notification Form* (ENF) for the proposed project at 23 Popes Island, New Bedford, MA and would like to offer the following comments.

As indicated in the *Massachusetts Natural Heritage Atlas* (14<sup>th</sup> Edition), a portion of the proposed project site has been mapped as *Priority and Estimated Habitat* for state-listed tern species which are protected pursuant to the Massachusetts Endangered Species Act (M.G.L c. 131A) and its implementing regulations (MESA, 321 CMR 10.00) as well as the rare species provisions of the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Act (WPA, 310 CMR 10.37).

Projects that will occur within *Priority* and *Estimated Habitat* for state-listed species, which are not otherwise exempt from MESA review pursuant to 321 CMR 10.14, require a direct filing with the Division for compliance with the Massachusetts Endangered Species Act (MESA 321 CMR 10.00). According to the information contained within the ENF, the pile anchored barges and reconfiguration zone are proposed within *Priority Habitat*. Based on the information contained within the ENF and in advance of a formal filing pursuant to the MESA, the Division anticipates that any state-listed species concerns can be addressed during the MESA review process.

The Division will not render a final decision until the MEPA review process and associated public and agency comment period is completed, and until all required MESA filing materials are submitted by the proponent to the Division. As our MESA review is not complete, no alteration to the soil, surface, or vegetation and no work associated with the proposed project shall occur on the property until the

Division has made a final determination or until all work has been demonstrated to occur outside of *Priority* and *Estimated Habitat*.
