NEW HEARINGS:

1. A Request for Determination of applicability as filed by Eversource Energy of Massachusetts for property identified as Phillips Road/Church Street and Route 140 overpass public right-of-way, New Bedford, MA. The applicant proposes to install a gas main under the road and highway adjacent to a wetland resource area. Representative is Rebecca Weissman of SWCA Environmental Consultants, Inc.

Ms. Rebecca Weissman present tonight representing Eversource Energy. Ms. Weissman stated that since last year, Eversource has started a multi-year project of installing two parallel natural gas mains on the intersection of Phillips Road and Church Street. The vast majority of the project is a minor buffer zone utility project within a paved roadway surface area. There is one exception to this work, with the installation of the gas main via jack and bore methods beneath Route 140 within the 100-foot buffer zone of a highway drainage



swale wetland. All work will be performed in a manner aimed to reduce the potential for any adverse impacts on resource areas during construction. Post-construction measures will also be implemented to stabilize any disturbed areas. Eversource will install and maintain Best Management Practices (BMPs) to protect regulated resource areas, including straw wattles, silt fence, and catch basin silt sacks where appropriate. Project will start in August and last about 4-5 months.

Commissioner Linhart asked if this was an existing distribution line and what they are proposing with seeding and if trees would be planted. Me. Weissman stated that this is an existing line and would increase the capacity and at the moment only seeding is proposed but would look into planting trees to replace those knocked down.

Agent Perks recommends a *Negative Box 6 Determination of Applicability* for work done in existing approved ROW for utilities for public good.

Vice-Chairman Carney made a motion to issue a Negative Box 6 Determination with the conditions that no stockpiling will take place within the 100ft buffer, the stockpiling be appropriately controlled with the erosion controls, and planting of trees.

1. Pine Hill Park earth day clean up 4/20/22.

Agent Perks informed the Commission about an old Grist Mill that was found in the Pine Hill Park area. The Earth Day clean up will be from 10am-1pm with the help of DPI and Eversource.

2. East Beach Parking Lot Renovations.

Agent Perks informed the Commission that this was just an informational session since the required paperwork and legal ad was not completed. Chairman Audette advised the Commission that this would just be them presenting and no questions would be asked until they came back for the open meeting.

Ms. Jessica Wala from Nitsch was present tonight to give the informational presentation about the proposed East beach Parking Lot Green Infrastructure Retrofit improvements at the three



existing East Beach parking lots. The Project is located within jurisdictional wetland resource areas associated with the Outer New Bedford Harbor. This Project is being funded by a Coastal Pollution Remediation Grant from the Massachusetts Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EEA) Office of Coastal Zone Management (CZM) and will provide improved water quality and flood mitigation for stormwater being discharged to the Outer New Bedford Harbor. The site consists of three separate parking lots located along Rodney French Boulevard East. The improvements include reconstructing and greening the existing parking lot and providing water quality treatment through bioretention basins.

3. Samuel Barnett Water main replacement.

Agent Perks stated that the Department of Public Infrastructure is working with MASSDOT and Eversource in replacing an old existing 12" pipe with a new 12" pipe. The application with MASSDOT requires a formal letter of acknowledgement from the Commission.
