

New initiatives are shaping land use and development and continue to strengthen downtown, protect neighborhoods, support the needs of emerging economic development sectors, encourage the adaptive reuse of historic mills, and require sustainable design standards for all development.





Opportunity Zone Goals

- Promote the adaptive reuse of historic assets and encourage new development along the water's edge.
- Attract private sector investment for maritimespecific uses to critical waterfront brownfield properties that have been identified as priority development sites in recently completed urban renewal district planning.
- Encourage a "New Bedford First" approach to the hiring of local contractors and service providers as well as the employment of New Bedford residents for all projects taking place in New Bedford Opportunity Zones.
- Expansion of development efforts in creating market rate housing.

- In the past two years alone, New Bedford has celebrated a new \$11 million boutique hotel and two new brewpubs in historic downtown New Bedford. Add to this the continued expansion of the New Bedford Whaling Museum, a bustling arts and culture scene, and nearly a dozen new smaller retails and food/drink establishments welcoming residents and visitors alike.
- State lawmakers passed legislation permitting up to 20% of the State Pier to be used for mixed development incentivizing new growth and diversification.
- The UMass Dartmouth School for Marine and Science Technology (SMAST) cut the ribbon on its new \$55 million research facility in the fall of 2017. The Project adds a state-of-the-art research facility on New Bedford's Waterfront.

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
