




### Foreign Trade Zone # 28 located in New Bedford, Massachusetts is your zone of opportunity

- Lower Cost of Living Higher Quality of Life






















#### What is An "FIZ"?

- Secure Area located at or near a Port of Entry
- Legally outside the Customs territory of the U.S.
- In an FTZ merchandise may be:
  - Assembled, manufactured or processed
  - Sampled or Mixed
  - Relabeled, Repacked or Repaired
  - Destroyed




#### What is An "FIZ"?

- Concept of FTZs is as old as civilization
- Created in U.S. on June 18, 1934 as part of the New Deal
- Purpose:
  - to encourage and expedite U.S. participation in international trade;
  - to defer payment of duties until goods are entered into the commerce of the U.S.



#### What is An "FIZ"?

- Two Basic Types of FTZs
  - General Purpose Zone
    - New Bedford Airport
    - Port of New Bedford
    - Portion of New Bedford Business Park
  - Subzone
    - single purpose site when the operations cannot feasibly be moved to, or accommodated in a general purpose zone



# Duty Deferral

Customs duty & federal excise tax
 only paid when merchandise is
 transferred out of the FTZ for
 domestic consumption



## Duty Deferral

- Let's Look At An Example
  - \$ Volume of imports
  - Inventory Turns/Year
  - x Duty Rate
  - x Opportunity Cost of Capital
  - = Savings



### Duty Deferral

• Let's Look At An Example

Volume of imports

\$50,000,000.00

Inventory Turns/Year

÷ 2

**Duty Rate** 


x 5%

Opportunity Cost of Capital

x 6%

Savings

\$75,000.00



### Duty Elimination

- Goods may be exported from the FTZ free of duty and federal excise tax
- Goods may be destroyed in an FTZ
   without payment of duty or federal
   excise tax
- Duty is not paid on waste or scrap in an FTZ



## Duty Elimination

### • Let's Look At An Example

Exported goods are never entered into to commerce of the United States, thus import duties are never assessed



### Duty Elimination

• Let's Look At An Example

Volume of imports \$50,000,000

Duty Rate x 5%

Duty \$2,500,000

Volume of imports \$50,000,000

Duty Rate x 0%

Duty \$0



## Duty Reduction

- In an FTZ you decide which duty rate to pay
  - the rate on the component parts as admitted to the FTZ
  - the rate on the finished product as removed from the FTZ (Inverted Tariff)



## Duty Reduction

#### • Let's Look At An Example

Imported components duty rate	5%
Finished product duty rate	2%

 $$50,000,000 \times 5\% = $2,500,000$ 

 $$50,000,000 \times 2\% = $1,000,000$ 

Savings = \$1,500,000
