24.67 Proposal for Conservation of New Bedford Liberty Hall Theater Playbills, Broad sides & Programs 1860-1880

The playbills, broadsides and programs from the New Bedford Liberty Hall Theater date from 1860 through 1880. The archival documents number approximately 1233 sheets ranging in size from 3 x 5 inches to 12 x 48 inches. They are currently stored in 2 (3' x 4') and 1 (2' x 3') flat file drawers. The majority of the sheets are stored stacked within archival folder stock folders, some with glassine interleaving, with the exception of 1 dozen sheets that were matted for previous exhibition and 11 sheets that have been encapsulated in mylar.



Condition assessment:

Due to the large number and fragility of the playbills, broadsides and programs, an item-by-item survey could not be undertaken, however the contents of each folder were visually examined to gain an understanding of the general condition as well as particular condition concerns.

Condition issues noted:

- Embrittlement
- Discoloration
- Fragmentation, separation, losses
- Tears, fractures, cracks
- Creases, folds
- Staining, offset discoloration
- Discolored adhesive used to affix a gutter or to attach multiple sheets together
- Old tape mends (numerous glassine mends & few pressure-sensitive tape mends)
- Surface grime

Based on the preliminary examination of each folder the following observations and condition assessments were made regarding condition. The condition of the largest works, approximately 1/4 of the collection (233 sheets), exhibit the most severe mechanical damage, particularly around the perimeter of each sheet, presumably from exposure and contact while stored for many years in a stack. Many of these sheets are poor quality, wood pulp containing paper and exhibit fracturing, cracking and loss due to the severe embrittlement of the paper. As the sheets reduce in scale, the quality of the paper and the corresponding condition appear to improve. That said, there are papers of all condition within each size group. Based on the severity of damage, conservation needs were broken down into designations based on the extent of treatment required from major (i.e. lining/extensive mending, tape removal, flattening), moderate (i.e. separation of adhered sheets, moderate amount of mending, flattening), minor (minimal mending, flattening).

Broad Collection Condition Assessment Results

Major	233 (approximately 1/4 of collection)
Moderate	464 (approximately 1/2 of collection)
Minor	337 (approximately 1/4 of collection)

The goal of conservation is stabilization of each individual sheet to enable safe handling for digitization. Stabilization will require conservation treatment to separate attached sheets, reattach fragmented sheets, reunite displaced fragments, support brittle and weak paper, remove discolored tape (as possible), repair tears, flatten folds and distortions. Treatment will be undertaken with attention to retention of historical evidence of usage as well as past archival preservation format and organization (i.e. gutters, sewn signature groupings and paper tabs from previous storage).

Conservation treatment procedures will vary based on the requirements of each individual sheet and may include some or all of the following treatment procedures:

- Photographic documentation will be carried out before during and after treatment, as follows:
 - Representative 35mm digital studio photography of select works before and after treatment to demonstrate the range of condition issues and conservation treatment procedures required by the collection.
 - Informal snapshot photography in order to track the groupings and organization of the collection prior to separation of individual sheets and will be used as reference during treatment and in preparation for final storage.
 - Conservation-in-action photography to demonstrate the range of conservation treatment procedures and can be used for publicity or presentation.
- Written documentation will be provided after treatment to:
 - Document the full range of condition issues encountered within the collection.
 - Describe in full the conservation treatment procedures for future reference.

- Note any additional information pertinent to procedures and future preservation. These notes will be made in a format to be determined in cooperation with the Art Curator in order to best integrate with the future catalog database.
- Separate historical groupings and signatures to enable digitization of each individual sheet.
Groups of sheets have been gathered together and attached by means of two distinct methods:
 1. Glued directly to one another with a discolored adhesive along the top edge. The glue is presumed to be a protein adhesive based upon the yellow color and transparency, and therefore the sheets are likely to separate with humidity or steam.
 2. Gathered together with folded paper tabs along the top/short end of the sheet. These tabs were then folded together as a signature and secured together with three threads. Many of the threads appear to have been lost, but many of the groupings remain intact. These appear to be grouped by date or event and are presumed to have been grouped at an early date in the history of the collection.

Many of the sheets have torn horizontally as a result of the mechanical action of flipping through the adhered groupings. The paper is too brittle to enable this physical manipulation. Some tabs bare only a small fragment of the sheet to which it was originally attached as the papers have been torn. Therefore, it is recommended to separate the tabs and store each sheet individually to enable digitization and prevent further damage. Once the placement and orientation of the sheets within each signature is recorded, the tabs will be discretely cut long the top fold to separate each sheet. Torn sheets will be mended and loose sheets that have become separated from their tabs will be reunited with the loose paper, as possible, and reattached by conservation treatment.

Groupings that are attached by direct glueing will be detached by application of moisture, either by ultrasonic humidification, steam or washing, as necessary. Residual adhesive and staining is likely to remain.

- Surface cleaning will be undertaken only when a sheet is extremely dusty or grimy or when further conservation treatment is required. Surface cleaning will be carried out with grated white vinyl eraser, non-latex rubber sponges, block eraser and scalpels as deemed appropriate for each individual sheet.
- Removal of old repairs will be carried out if the repair has/will result in damage, when not deemed to be historical evidence, and when necessary to properly mend and/or flatten the sheet. Some examples of old repairs include yellowed pressure-sensitive tape, discolored glassine tape mending strips, and discolored paper fills.
- Tears will be mended if they jeopardize the integrity of the sheet or inhibit safe handling and digitization. Mending will be carried out with thin, toned Japanese paper and wheat starch paste. These thin paper mends will be discrete in tone and sufficiently translucent to be used on double-sided sheets, as well as single-sided sheets, without detracting from or obscuring the image or text.
- Loose fragments and split sheets will be reattached to retain the integrity of the sheet and allow for safe handling and digitization. Generally this will be carried out by mending in the manner described above or with overall lining as described below. Bunches of fragments that have become separated from their sheets are currently stored in two folders. Those fragments will be reattached in their proper location if the companion sheet can be identified. Some loose fragments may remain. These will be stored in a sleeve or envelope to be retained within the archive for possible future identification/placement.
- Losses will not be filled except in limited instances when structure and handling is compromised. Generally large losses of this nature will be bridged with Japanese paper and wheat starch paste for structural support without aesthetic integration. On rare occasion loss compensation can be carried out with paper of a sympathetic tone and color to match the artifact, if desired by the Art Curator.
- Washing will be undertaken only for select documents for which the discoloration is endemic to embrittlement and fragility and requires wet treatment to restore necessary flexibility to the paper, in preparation for lining, to remove extensive discolored glassine tape repairs or if specified by the Art Curator. Other discoloration or staining will not be addressed. Proper spot testing will be undertaken to ensure that each document is stable to water prior to undertaking any overall wet treatment.
- Lining will follow washing when necessary to preserve the integrity of brittle sheets, to reattach sheets with numerous large fragments or to stabilize sheets with extensive tears. Lining is preferred in the case of necessary overall stabilization, though encapsulation in a mylar sleeve may be necessary for select double-sided sheets. Both options can be discussed and a final format can be determined in consultation with the Art Curator. Individual sheets will be lined with thin, natural tone Japanese paper adhered with wheat starch paste. Once dry, the linings can be trimmed tight to the sheet or with a small handling margin as preferred by the Art Curator.
- Humidification and flattening will be carried out as necessary to enable complete and accurate digitization.

The timeline for conservation will align with the grant cycle June 2025 - June 2026, or as designated by the client.

Storage recommendations:

Preferred storage consists of, sheets stacked in their historical groupings within an archival paper folder with glassine interleaving between each sheet and placed within an archival stock folder within a flat file drawer or archival box. The order of the documents will be determined in consultation with the Art Curator

Currently 10 folders size 36 x 48 inches

Retain one 36 x 48 inch folder for largest sheets

Consider cutting existing folders in half at fold/ or create new 18 folders size 18 x 48 inches

Up to twice as many folders of this size may be needed with increased depth once fully interleaved.

Currently 13 folders size 24 x 36 inches

Consider adjusting size of folders to:

Approximately 18 folders size 12 x 36 inches (3 across in six stacks? per drawer or individually boxed in 3 boxes to be placed in wooden cabinet or on open shelving)

Approximately 24 folders size 12 x 18 inches (4 side-by-side stacks of 6 per drawer or individually boxed in 4 boxes to be placed in wooden cabinet or on open shelving)

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Liberty Hall Playbill Conservation project will conserve the collection of playbills and broadsides advertising concerts, lectures, and other entertainment at New Bedford's Liberty Hall from 1865 through 1879. The collection of approximately 1,145 sheets needs to be conserved and stabilized in order to protect from further loss and allow for digitization of the collection to increase public access to this City owned resource. This project recommendation will fund the conservation of the most at-risk items in need of urgent attention.

GRANT FUNDING CONDITIONS

1. CPA funds are to be used for the conservation of the items determined to be of high treatment difficulty.
2. Other conditions as deemed necessary and defined within the Community Preservation Act Municipal Project Memorandum of Agreement.

This Memorandum of Agreement (“MOA”) is entered into by and between the City of New Bedford’s Community Preservation Committee (“CPC”) and the New Bedford Free Public Library (“Department”) subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Project Scope of Work.** City Council has allocated these CPA funds only for the purposes specified in the CPC Recommendation provided to and approved by the New Bedford City Council. Any material changes to the project from what was represented in the application and during the project selection process in relationship to the use of CPA funds requires advance written approval by the CPC. In making its decision, the CPC will determine whether the proposed use of CPA funding is consistent with the City Council approval, and if it is not, it will require further approval by City Council. Any project work funded from other (non-CPA) sources is not subject to this process.
- 2. Project Liaison.** The CPA Manager shall serve as the Project Liaison for the MOA. The Project Liaison shall serve as the agent of the CPC for the purpose of monitoring the project’s compliance with the terms of this MOA and shall periodically report to the CPC regarding the progress of the project and compliance with the terms of this MOA.
- 3. Compliance with Laws and MOA.** The Department understands and agrees that the Project is funded pursuant to the Community Preservation Act, M.G.L. c. 44B and subject to the requirements thereof. The Department further agrees to comply with all applicable federal and state laws, regulations and City ordinances, including, when applicable, adherence to State procurement requirements and procedures, which in any manner affect the performance of this agreement and the requirements of this MOA.
- 4. Permits and Licenses.** It is the obligation of the Department to obtain all necessary permits and licenses for implementation of the Project. No local permit or license is waived or guaranteed by the award of this funding. The CPA Manager will assist the Department in securing preservation restrictions, accessibility waivers for historic resources, or any other approvals necessary to comply with the Community Preservation Act as appropriate.
- 5. Replacement of City Funds:** Consistent with the provisions of M.G.L. c. 44B. Section 6, CPA funds set aside may be expended in any city or town. The community preservation funds shall not replace or reimburse existing operating funds, only augment them.
- 6. Record Keeping.** The Department shall retain any and all records associated with utilization of the grant funds and kept in the normal course of business, and such additional records as may be required by the CPC for a period of six (6) years. Should the Project have multiple funding sources, the Department shall track specific expenditures of the CPA funds separate from other funding sources. The CPC shall have full and free access to such records and may examine and copy such records. The Department further agrees to meet with the CPC or its designee from time to time, upon reasonable request, to discuss expenditures of the Funds.
- 7. CPA Funds Disbursement:** All expenditures for goods and services for Municipal Projects funded through the City of New Bedford Community Preservation Act shall be made in accordance with the financial

practices and policies of the City of New Bedford. Please see ***Municipal Projects Disbursement Process*** at the end of this agreement.

- 8. Signage:** If the project involves construction or restoration work, the Department will erect a temporary sign recognizing that Community Preservation Act Funds have been used to complete this work. The CPC will provide sign specifications. The sign can be installed on an existing fence or wall, or using posts, and should remain in a visible location while the CPA funded work is underway. Any articles, website postings, or project announcements should also note the *New Bedford Community Preservation Act* support for this project. If permanent signage is installed at the project site, the CPC will require the CPA funding contribution to be noted on the signage.
- 9. Deed Restrictions:** Pursuant to M.G.L. c. 44B §12, every project that involves the acquisition of any interest in real property with CPA funds shall be bound by a permanent deed restriction that meets the requirements of M.G.L. c. 184, limiting the use of the interest to the purpose for which it was acquired. Where applicable, the Department agrees to the imposition of such deed restriction in a form acceptable to the CPC.
- 10. Project Updates:** Every THREE (3) MONTHS until the Completion Date, the Department shall provide the CPC with a Project Status Report which details the progress toward completion of the Work. The CPC requires notification by email to the CPA Manager when a project has commenced and again when it is completed. The CPA Manager may contact the Department periodically to check the status of a project or schedule a site visit to document any completed work.
- 11. Project Completion:** Once the project is complete, a final site visit will be conducted and/or the CPC will request copies of any completed studies or materials for its files. Projects should be completed within one (1) year following the execution of this MOA. A Project Closeout Report is required for submittal within thirty days of project completion.
- 12. Unused CPA Project Funds:** In the event the total cost of the project is less than the award amount, or if the project is terminated prior to its completion, any unexpended CPA funds that have been awarded to the Department for the project shall be returned to the CPA Fund Balance.
- 13. Term.** The term of this Grant Award is from the date of approval by City Council, **APRIL 10, 2025**, (the “Commencement Date”) until **JUNE 30, 2026** (the “Completion Date”). All work described in this MOA must be completed no later than the Completion Date unless the New Bedford CPC grants an extension in writing for good cause shown.

If no Project funds have been expended by the Department for the Project within six (6) months of the Commencement Date and are not expected to be expended prior to the Completion Date, the Department must present a request for a term extension to the CPC, providing a Project Update comprised of a revised timeline and revised scope of work to confirm that funds are still required for the Project as recommended by the CPC and approved by the City Council. If the Department does not comply

with the submission of a Project Update or the CPC does not approve of the Project Update, the CPA funds shall be returned to the CPA Fund account from which the Funds were originally appropriated.

Funds not utilized on the Project must be returned to the Community Preservation Fund and will be made available for future appropriation to other recipients.




14. Breach: In the event the CPC alleges that the Department has failed to fulfill its obligations under the terms of this MOA, the CPC shall deliver written notice to the Department indicating such, and the Department shall have ninety (90) days, or a reasonable time as agreed by the parties, to fulfill its obligations. In the event the Department requires additional time to fulfill its obligations under the MOA and demonstrates a good faith effort to do so, the Department and the CPC may, by written mutual agreement, extend the term of the MOA.

If, after reasonable notice, the Department fails to fulfill its obligations under the MOA, the CPC shall have the right, in its sole discretion, to terminate this MOA. Upon receipt of notice of such termination, the Department shall refund all undisbursed Funds, and such Funds shall be returned to the CPA Fund account from which the Funds were originally appropriated. Notwithstanding the foregoing, failure or delay in performance due to Acts of God or other causes factually beyond Grantee's control and without fault or negligence shall not be deemed a breach of the MOA if immediate notice of such is given to the CPC.

15. Severability. If any term or condition of this MOA or any application thereof shall to any extent be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the validity, legality, and enforceability of the remaining terms and conditions of this MOA shall not be deemed affected thereby.

16. Entire Agreement. This Agreement, together with all Attachments, Appendices and Addenda (if applicable), constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto, and may be amended only in writing duly executed by both the CPC and the Department.

MUNICIPAL PROJECTS DISBURSEMENT PROCESS

Each Municipal Department receiving CPA funding will work directly with the Finance Department to set up any Purchase Orders or to complete any bidding requirements necessary for a municipal project.

- Once the CPA appropriation is approved by the City Council, the CPA Manager will coordinate with the City Finance Department to create a budget for the project under the CPA Fund equaling the amount approved by the City Council. The Department is responsible for submitting a budget to the Finance Department in order to establish the project budget with the necessary line items for the Project. The Department will follow all City of New Bedford processes and procedures for encumbering and spending CPA funds.
- Once a Purchase Order has been authorized by the Finance Department, the Department shall submit that information to the CPA Manager; all invoices associated with that Purchase Order may then be paid by the Department without further review by the CPC. Although individual invoices do not need to be submitted for approval under this process, Municipal Departments are requested to forward ***copies*** of invoices to the CPA Manager for the CPA project files.
- Municipal Departments are requested to contact the CPA Manager at the start of their project and to forward any RFP or bid documents for a project to include in the CPA project files. Site visits may be scheduled periodically during the course of a project in order to document the work for the CPC project files.
- At project completion, the Department will submit to the CPA Manager a Munis report detailing all project invoices paid and copies of all invoices. The CPA Manager will confirm all work performed was within the approved project scope of work. Upon confirmation, the CPA Manager will submit a service transfer request to Finance for the transfer of CPA funds to the Department.

If a project overlaps fiscal years, the Department will submit a Munis report in June of that fiscal year detailing all project invoices paid and copies of all invoices. The CPA manager will confirm all work performed was within the approved project scope of work. Upon confirmation, the CPA manager will submit a service transfer request to Finance for the transfer of CPA funds to the Department.

Current Condition

The items ranged in condition from good (1) to very poor (4) upon their examination. The pieces had been reorganized since the time of the initial inventory and some materials were no longer near each other in the folders. There were 1,141 entries counted across 22 folders, but these were further divided into 841 unique item groups due to how they were previously gathered. Of these 1,142, 269 items have either multiple copies of the same broadside/program under one entry or have secondary materials (stubs with pertinent information) attached. One folder contained a significant number of fragments and has been counted as one item (1,142) for the purposes of the estimate. 68 items provided on the initial inventory were not found and may be within this folder of fragments or may be completely lost. Many new entries were recorded or expanded as similar items had been separated. The total actual number of items is likely therefore somewhere between 1,410-1,550.

In total, 350 items were deemed to be in good (1) condition, 496 were deemed to be in fair (2) condition, 169 were deemed to be in poor (3) condition, and 127 were deemed to be in very poor (4) condition. For 270 items, conservation treatment was deemed to be of low priority to facilitate digitization. For 474 items, conservation treatment was deemed to be of medium priority to facilitate digitization. For 398 items, conservation treatment was deemed to be of high priority to facilitate digitization.

Common issues affecting the broadsides were: embrittled papers; tattering and losses; text compressing creases that had led to breaks in the paper and obstruction of the text; glassine or pressure sensitive tape (PST) repairs; separation and fragmentation of the items; stubs from a previous binding at the upper edge; forcible separations, adhesive creep, and discoloration from attached stubs; foxing; weakened or

softened papers. Some of the items may be able to be imaged as they are, but a vast majority of them will be difficult to access and doing so will cause damage to the other items in the folder. A secondary table is provided with a representative breakout of these conditions at an item level along with costs. A more searchable spreadsheet will be provided if the job is approved. However, it is encouraged that the client approves items at folder level due to the current state of organization of the materials and their delicate nature. Below is a list of potential treatments that an item may go through. Not all items will need all treatment steps to stabilize them for digitization, but below is the minimum treatment needed on the most damaged objects to make them easy to be stabilized and organized for capture and handling.

Recommended Conservation Treatment Plan

- Provide representative written and photographic documentation of condition before and after treatment.
- Collate multiple item jobs referencing existing inventory. Create an Excel spreadsheet to track large archival jobs.
- Reduce surface soil, fly specks, and accretions using dry cleaning techniques as possible/necessary.
- Test solubility of inks and adhesives.
- After confirming that the media will permit aqueous treatment, humidify and wash in a filtered water bath to clean the paper and reduce staining, discoloration, and acidity. Alkalized water may be used to reduce staining.
- Remove tapes, mends, stubs, and residual adhesive during the washing procedure as needed.
- Mend breaks and fill losses with Japanese paper and wheat starch paste to stabilize for imaging.
- If needed, Line the object for additional support with Japanese paper and wheat starch paste and/or methyl cellulose.
- Reattach any stubs or secondary materials and rejoin items as necessary. Client will be contacted if needed on rejoining the items.
- Humidify and flatten between blotters or felts under moderate pressure.
- Rehouse items in archival folders with polyester sleeves and interleaving as deemed necessary; Box folders together in standard sized boxes as able.



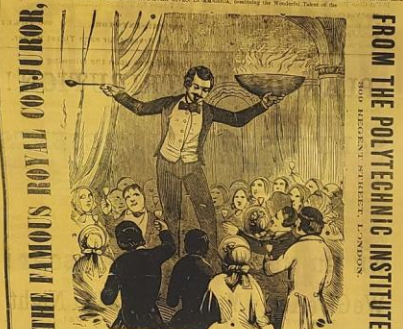

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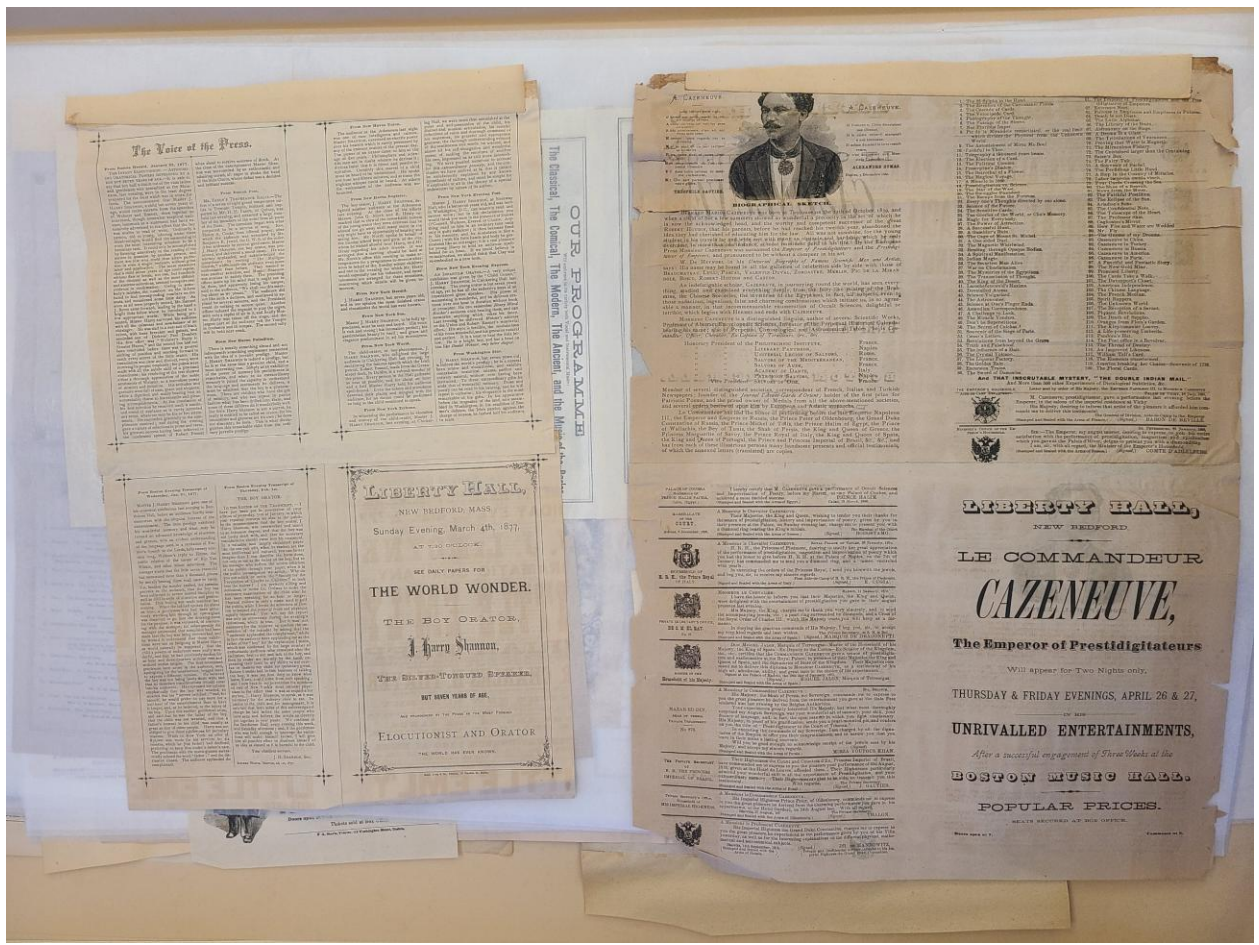
